In the name of God Amen I John Philips of Prince Georges County in y^e Province of Maryland being sick of body but thanks be to God of sound and perfect memory but reflecting on the uncertainty of this transitory life do make this my last will & Testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills and Testaments heretofore made by me either in word or writing consisting and appointing this only to be my last will and Testament & I hereby bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it me & my body to the grave in sure and certain hopes of a resurrection at the great day of Judgment in whom they will again be joynd together in eternal felicity & for ordering & disposing of such goods & Chattels as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with I will that all such debts as I owe in right & conscience be discharged in convenient time after my decease & the remainder to be disposed of in form and manner following Viz^t first I leave and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Ann Philips my plantation including one & a hundred acres of Land during her natural life & afterwards to my daughter Elizabeth & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever. 2^{dly} I leave & bequeath unto my well beloved son Beddoe one hundred acres of Land adjoining to y^e afo^r wife's hundred acres a crop the y^e afores^d tract joyning to the plantation to him & his heirs forever. 3^{dly} I leave & bequeath unto my well beloved son Philip one hundred acres of Land adjoining to the afo^r Beddoe hundred acres to him the s^d Philip & his heirs forever. 4^{thly} I leave and bequeath unto my well beloved son Thomas all the remainder part of the tract of Land I bought of Henry Arbery lying in Fairfax County of Virginia

to him the said Thomas & his heirs forever & ^{thly} lastly I conclude & appoint my wife as
 Ann Philips my whole ^{est.} of this my last will and Testament & to confirm the same I
 have hereunto set my hand the date & Day under written
